FTA grant(s) will be applied for by the Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority renovation of the Neuwirth Motors building located at 520 N. Third Street, Wilmington, NC, bus drive aisles to access the facility, and associated furnishings and ADP upgrades. Upon completion, the facility will serve as an off street bus transfer location for Wave Transit passengers.

No persons, families, or businesses will be displaced by this project. The service area of the project includes New Hanover County and its immediate urbanized environs as defined by the planning area boundary of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization.

No significant environmental impact is expected upon the service area as a result of this project.

These projects are in the adopted Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program, State Transportation Improvement Program, and the Unified Planning Work Program, for the Wilmington metropolitan area. The projects were adopted by the NC Board of Transportation on May 05, 2016.

The project will take into consideration the special needs of the elderly and disabled by providing half fare rates for those persons age 65 and older and qualified disabled individuals utilizing the

fixed route service. In addition, complementary Paratransit service is available for those individuals who meet the criteria outlined in the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority will afford an opportunity for all interested parties to be heard with respect to the social, environmental, and economic aspects of the above projects, if requested.
